

Deputy's Corner

The Deputies here in Weddington wanted to take a minute to cover a couple of things that we have been seeing recently. With today's technology so easily accessible and in our hands, the roads are more dangerous than ever. We need to keep a conscious mind on how important it is to pay attention to the roads. Email, texting, checking social media all play a part in adding to the already dangerous situation of driving. North Carolina has specifically put into effect a law that makes it illegal to do such things.

G.S. 20-137.4A. Unlawful use of mobile telephone for text messaging or electronic mail.

- (a) Offense. It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a vehicle on a public street or highway or public vehicular area while using a mobile telephone to:
 - (1) Manually enter multiple letters or text in the device as a means of communicating with another person; or
 - (2) Read any electronic mail or text message transmitted to the device or stored within the device, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to any name or number stored in the device nor to any caller identification information

We also wanted to cover another problem that is a constant, Speeding. Here in Weddington, there are a lot of neighborhoods, which means children. Speeding is something we can all control and must do so to prevent harm to ourselves and others. Weddington has several school zones and also is home to private schools as well. As stated before, driving is dangerous, speeding does nothing but increases that danger. The distance needed for a car to stop at 60mph ranges from 120ft to 140ft. Weddington has a lot of traffic that goes to and from Charlotte. Remember that here in Weddington the speed limit is 35 mph unless otherwise posted. Here is a portion of the NC General Statute for speeding. You can always find the laws for NC at www.ncga.state.nc.us.

G.S. § 20-141. Speed restrictions.

(a) No person shall drive a vehicle on a highway or in a public vehicular area at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then existing.

In inclement weather this is especially crucial.

Update from the Planning/Zoning Office...

New and Proposed Subdivisions

1. Weddington Matthews Rd - Preliminary Plat

The Weddington Matthews Rd Subdivision is a proposed 35 lot conservation subdivision on 49.69 acres located at the intersection of Weddington-Matthews Road and Hemby Road. The Planning Board approved the sketch plan with conditions at the February 27 meeting. The Preliminary Plat is currently under review.

2. <u>Harlow's Crossing (formerly Carringdon) – Final Plat</u>

Harlow's Crossing Subdivision is located on both the northeast and northwest corner of Weddington-Matthews Road and Beulah Church/Hemby Rd intersection. The Preliminary Plat was approved in September 2016. The final plat for Phase 1 including Map 1 and Map 2 was approved in June 2017. This includes 71 lots on 117.64 acres.

3. Canisteo - Preliminary Plat

Canisteo is a 15 lot conservation subdivision on 19.96 acres. The subdivision is on the corner of Highway 84 and Deal Road. The Planning Board reviewed the Preliminary Plat in October and the Town Council approved the plat on October 9, 2017.

4. <u>Graham Allen – Pre-</u> liminary Plat

The Graham Allen Subdivision is located at the corner of Weddington Matthews Road and Antioch Church Road. Access will be provided onto both roads. The subdivision is a 25 lot conventional subdivision on 41.53 acres. The Town Council approved the construction plans on July 10, 2017.

5. Atherton – Phase 2 Map 3 Final Plat

The preliminary plat for Atherton was approved in January, 2014. Atherton is a conventional subdivision with 130 lots on 170.81 acres. Atherton has access off of Cox Rd, Weddington Rd and Weddington Matthews Rd. The final plat for Phase 2 Map 3 was approved in April, 2017 which included 21 of the 130 total lots.

A Word From Our Tax Collector

Weddington property taxes are due on September 1 of every year and payable without penalty until January 5 of the following year. Property owners whose payments are postmarked on or after January 6 will be assessed a penalty of 2 percent interest for the month of January and an additional ¾ percent every month thereafter until the bill is paid.

Weddington Elections

Weddington voting districts are solely for the purpose of ensuring that members of the Town Council live in the different areas of the town. Each Council seat is elected by all the voters in town. This fall we will be electing the mayor, and council members from Districts 1 and 3. Regardless of the district where you reside,

you will see those council seat races on your fall ballot. Election day is Tuesday, November 7th. If you are unsure where to vote, go to www.unioncountync.gov/government/boards-and-committees/board-elections for information on your voting location.

A Letter from Mayor and Council

As noted in the last newsletter, our town continues to grow as an active vibrant community. Our current population is approximately 11,500 people. Our long-term planning efforts assume that the town will achieve a population of approximately 25,000 - 27,000 when fully built out with current town borders. The document that guides our vision is the Land Use Plan. It was developed with input from you, our residents. We are a residential town of approximately 11,000 acres. Only 35 acres are designated for commercial development. These 35 acres are located at Weddington Corners and are governed by a new Downtown Overlay District so the town has input and control over development.

The town's financial position is strong. We finished FY2016-17 with a \$270,000 surplus driven by tight budgets and strong fiscal controls. In spite of a 5% decline in tax revenue in 2015, we have kept taxes flat for the last 4 years and will do so again in FY2017-18.

We continue to lead the way in our support of neighborhood schools. While this is a State and County role, we communicate directly with UCPS on all new development projects in Weddington. This helps them in their planning efforts. Our ordinances requiring low-density housing help manage the impact of the rapid growth of our school populations.

Later this year we will be conducting a town survey to get your ideas and understand your desires on how our town should develop going forward. We do these surveys approximately every 5 years. The last one was done in 2012. Please respond to the survey when you receive it. Your input is critical in telling your elected officials how they can meet your needs.

With rapid growth comes increased traffic congestion. Working with Union Power Cooperative and NCDOT we added a street light at the intersection of Weddington-Matthews & Tilley Morris road. It increases night visibility at this intersection and helps the ongoing efforts to improve public safety. We implemented a Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) process. We are currently working with NCDOT on several projects including intersections, traffic flow and *line of sight* to improve traffic safety.

We had another very successful Litter Sweep on September 23rd. Over 50 volunteer hours were given by our residents picking up trash along our roadways. These efforts build pride in our community. I along with the council want to thank everyone for their time and effort to keep Weddington clean and a *Great Place to Live*.

Campaign signs are sprouting up around town. The 2017 elections are now in process with voting on November 7th. Please take part in the election process. Less than 1 in 6 registered voters participated in the last election. Do your homework and vote for the candidates you feel can best lead our town's future direction.

We are here to serve you. We encourage you to be engaged in your community. Town Council meetings are the second Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Give us your thoughts and ideas on how we can continue to improve the town of Weddington. Contact Lisa Thompson at town hall if you are interested in serving on a committee or board.
