WEDDINGTON TOWN HALL Information you might not know...

Weddington Town Hall is one of the most unique in Union County. It was built in 1894 and was originally known as the Thomas-Wrenn House. What is now the current Council Chambers was an addition in 1962. The Town agreed to purchase the house in 1992 for use as the Weddington Town Hall and it was designated as a Weddington Historic Home in 1994. Like most homes, but especially with one that is 122 years old, significant wood rot and assorted weather related damage occurs. In April the Town contracted with a company which specializes in the restoration of old, historic buildings. The contractor, Nu Hue, was given the task to come as close as possible to bringing the building back to its magnificent origin. We are delighted with the outcome and invite you to drive by and see for yourself.

An update on the Water Tower from Union County Public Works

We wrote you last December to update you on the progress of the new water tower being built on Hemby Road in Weddington. When completed, this new tower will significantly improve the water pressure in the Weddington area. At the time, we expected the tower to be in service by the end of May. The tower is essentially complete, however we regret that there has been a delay in the construction of the pump station that supplies water to this tank. Without the completion of this pump station we cannot fill the tank to its proper operating level to create this higher pressure in our system.



Our contractor working on this pump station has not yet completed all the work necessary to place the water tower in service. We are confident that once the pump station is up and running, we will be able to complete the project quickly and provide more consistent, sustainable water pressure for you and your family.

We now expect the project to be completed by late July or early August 2016. We appreciate your patience and understanding as we complete the project, and will be providing you further updates as we are ready to put the water tower in service. Update from the Planning/Zoning Office...

New and Proposed Subdivisions

Carringdon – Sketch Plan

Carringdon is a proposed 71 lot conservation subdivision located at the intersection of Weddington-Matthews

Road and Hemby Road. Public Involvement meetings were held on December 8th and 9th, and the Planning

Board approved the sketch plan with conditions at the December 21st meeting. The conditions have since been

> met by the applicant and staff is awaiting submittal of the preliminary plat.

<u>The Enclave at Weddington – Sketch Plan and Preliminary Plat</u>

The Planning Board approved a sketch plan application for a 42 lot conservation subdivision named The Enclave at Weddington on June 22nd, 2015. The proposed subdivision will have one access point off Antioch Church Road and will preserve the existing ponds on the property, as well as large sections of hardwood forest. The Council approved the preliminary plat on February 8th, 2016.

Sugar Magnolia – Preliminary Plat

On December, 21st, The Planning Board approved the Sketch Plan for the 18 lot conservation subdivision, Sugar Magnolia, located off Highway 84. The Public Involvement meetings were on November 2nd and November 3rd. The applicant has submitted the preliminary plat and it will likely be on the July Planning Board agenda for re-

Amenity site at The Falls at Weddington

The Town Council approved the preliminary plat for the 185 lot subdivision, The Falls at Weddington, on December 8th, 2014. The Town of Weddington Zoning Ordinance requires a conditional zoning approval for a subdivision amenity center, and the Town Council approved an application for an amenity center on September 14th, 2015. The approved site plan includes a club house and a pool, and the applicant is also required to get Council approval for all construction documents. The Construction Documents were approved on May 9th, 2016 by the Town Council

New Policy in Weddington

Viewshed and Conservation Land – Section 58-58; Section 58-4

The Town Council approved two text amendments to further prioritize viewshed in conservation subdivisions, both in Section 58-58 and Section 58-4. Furthermore, the Council also approved an amendment to Section 58-58 to encourage both sides of a conservation subdivision to contain 50% conservation land when the entire property is bisected by a major or minor thoroughfare.

Conditional Rezonings

All Saints Anglican Church

All Saints Anglican Church submitted a conditional zoning request for a church on approximately 8 acres, located off Hemby Rd. Phase 1 includes a 13,000 square foot structure, parking, and stormwater management facilities. The Planning Board reviewed the application on January 26th, 2015, and recommended approval with conditions to the Town Council. The Town Council approved the conditional rezoning on July 13th, 2015, and approved the construction documents on October 12th, 2015. The church is currently under construction.

Threshold Church

The Town Council approved Phase I for the Conditional Zoning request from Threshold Church in December of 2014 and the approved plan includes parking and a new driveway. Threshold Church has submitted a sketch plan for Phase II, and is undergoing the traffic impact analysis procedure with Town Staff and the Town's traffic consultant.

The Charlotte Regional Transportation Planning Organization (CRTPO) is the federallydesignated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Charlotte urbanized area. PUBLIC SAFETY UPDATE

Unsafe Driving at Optimist Park

Established in 1987, Weddington Optimist Park provides a positive and safe environment for our community to create lasting and joyful memories. Built entirely through dedicated volunteers, children learn sportsmanship, teamwork and the values to become productive future citizens.

Unfortunately in the last few weeks some of those future citizens who are now driving have demonstrated a blatant disrespect for the park. On several occasions, witnesses have reported young drivers doing "spin-outs" in the parking lots and speeding down the "straight away" at 30+ mph. These actions are clearly unsafe and is a serious concern for park officials.

If you are a coach, player, umpire or spectator, we ask for you to drive safely and adhere to Optimist Park's maximum speed limit of 15 mph. If you witness any unsafe driving, please get a vehicle description and call 911 to report it.

A Word From Our Tax Collector

Weddington property taxes are due on September 1 of every year and payable without penalty until January 6
of the following year. Property owners whose payments are postmarked on or after January 6 will be assessed
a penalty of 2 percent interest for the month of January and an additional ¾ percent every month thereafter
until the bill is paid.

The town tax rate for FY2016 is **\$0.052** per \$100 assessed valuation. The 2016 tax bills will go out at the end of July. The Town does not send tax notices to taxpayers whose taxes are paid through their escrow account. If you pay your taxes directly and have not received a tax notice by August 15, please contact the Tax Collector.

FINAL FISCAL YEAR BUDGET APPROVED

A public hearing on the Fiscal Year 2017 budget was held at the June 13, 2016 Council meeting and a final budget for the Town was approved by the Town Council. The tax rate will remain unchanged at 5.2 cents. The bulk of the budget is for public safety and is used to pay for fire and police services. A summary of the budget is shown here. 
