Coyote Safety Tips

Coyotes can be found in any open space and are being seen more and more in urban areas of the country. Today coyotes live in every part of North America.

Weddington is a rural community. Our residents need to remember that we have coyotes living here too which are wild and dangerous animals. During the springtime while our families are outside enjoying our backyards, hikes in the woods, or other outside activities, the coyotes may be more territorial as they guard their mates, dens, pups and food sources.

How can I keep my pets safe from coyotes at home?

- Never feed coyotes.
- Keep unattended cats and dogs indoors or in a completely enclosed run, especially at night and DO NOT ASSUME that a fence will keep them out of your back yard.
- Always accompany your leashed pet outside. Make sure you turn on lights if it is dark out to check your back yard for unexpected wildlife.
- NEVER leave pet food outside at night.
- Unless you have a coyote proof yard all pets in coyote prone areas should only go outside while on a 6 ft. leash or shorter held by a person. The smaller the dog the greater the risk. Coyotes are FAST. They can run up to 40 MPH, and have been clocked sprinting 45 MPH. (Even if you are standing in the yard with your pet), there is no way you can stop a coyote from running in at that speed, and biting, killing, or carrying off your small pet.

How can I keep my dog safe out on walks?

- Keep dogs on short leashes while walking outside; it is recommended to walk your pets on a leash no longer than 6 feet.
- Avoid walks in bushy areas or paths near abandoned properties. Walk in high pedestrian traffic areas.

What should I not do?

- Do not turn your back or run away from a coyote That is acting like prey.
- Do not allow a coyote to get in between you and your pet or child. If they are within 50 feet of you, do NOT bend down to pick up small animals. This may make you look like you are cowering and small. Get your pet as close to you as possible and make yourself look BIG!

What should I do if I see a coyote?

- Yell, clap your hands, use noisemakers such as whistles and horns.
- BIG! GET You want to appear bigger than the covote to scare it Raise off. vour arms, wave them around, and shout as loud as you can to scare off the covote. If you have on a jacket OPEN it up and flap it like a cape.



- Keep your pet as close to you as possible, but do not bend over.
- Carry an air horn to blow or scare the coyotes away while hiking or walking.
- Remember to walk away backward, but never turn your back and run away.

Is my bigger dog safe?

Coyote size determines the size of its prey. Easily they can kill small pets like cats, and small dogs. Single coyote are known to kill animals up to the size of a Bobcat (20 to 30 lbs). Packs of coyote can take down an animal weighing over 500 lbs. Any loose large dog is at risk without close supervision.

Coyotes are smart animals, and are well known for their athletic abilities. As spring and summer family activities head outdoors, please be aware of your environment.

Update from the Planning/Zoning Office...

New and Proposed Subdivisions

1 <u>Weddington Matthews Rd – Sketch Plan</u>

The Weddington Matthews Rd Subdivision is a proposed 35 lot conservation subdivision on 49.69 acres. It is located at the intersection of Weddington-Matthews Road and Hemby Road. Public Involvement meetings were held on February 20, 2017, and the Planning Board approved the sketch plan with conditions at the February 27 meeting.

2 <u>The Falls at Weddington – Final Plat</u> <u>Phase 1 Map 3 and Map 4</u>

The Falls at Weddington Subdivision preliminary plat consists of 185 lots and was approved on December 8, 2014. The subdivision is located on both sides of Antioch Church Rd and is being developed by Falls at Weddington, LLC, as an RCD conservation subdivision. The final plat for Map 3 and Map 4 was approved by Town Council December 12, 2016.

3 <u>The Woods – Final Plat Phase 1 Map1</u> <u>and Map 2</u>

On December 12, 2016 the Town Council


approved 124 lots within the Wood Subdivision located on NC Hwy 84/Weddington Road.

4 <u>Weddington Pond – Preliminary Plat</u>

Weddington Pond is an 18 lot Residential Conservation Subdivision on 18.95 acres located off Weddington Road (Highway 84). The Planning Board approved the Sketch Plan on December 22nd, 2015 and the Town Council approved the Preliminary Plat November 14, 2017.

5 Deal Road Rezoning

The Town Council approved a rezoning for property located at 5800 Deal Road, (parcels 06-072-003A and 06 -072-003E) from R-40 to R-CD. Combined the tracts are a total 10.169 acres. The property was rezoned in order to combine the two parcels with parcel 06-066-011A to the North (which is currently zoned RCD) and develop the land for residential purposes.



Property Purchase

The Town of Weddington is excited to announce the purchase of 3.232 acres of property at 6924 Matthews-Weddington Road. This property sits adjacent to the current town hall and directly behind Weddington Corners Shopping Center.

The property was purchased from long standing Weddington residents Ella Virginia Matthews and Kenneth Jeffrey Matthews, and has been in the JT Matthews family since February 9, 1932.

Purchase Price: The purchase price was \$592,250.00 and was paid in full out of the Town's fund balance. Our fund balance is set aside for these opportunities, to assist with infrastructure expenditures, and for strategic long-range planning initiatives.

Why did the Town purchase the property?

The purchase of this property provides the Town a combined total of 5.322 contiguous acres in the center of our downtown district. The property provides our community with so many wonderful growth opportunities. Examples include:

Expansion of the town hall facilities if needed, green space, a potential town park, expanded area to support town events, and other outdoor activities for our town residents.

The Town would also like to recognize the Matthews family for a generous \$35,000.00 charitable contribution to the Town of Weddington.

Letter from the Town Council

Weddington continues to grow as an active vibrant community. Our reputation for great schools, low taxes, and large lots in a rural setting with limited commercial areas are what fuels this growth and makes Weddington *a* great place to live.

Your council worked with NCDOT to rebuild the accident-prone curve on Tilley Morris road near the entrance into the Vintage Creek subdivision. We continue to work with NCDOT on adding turn lanes, roundabouts and repairing road shoulders in our efforts to support public safety and manage the increasing traffic congestion as our town grows.

Our fire department recently received an ISO class 3 rating from the North Carolina Department of Insurance. This applies to all three fire stations and supports the superior safety services needed for the growing number of residents living in Weddington. It will also provide reduced insurance costs for the commercial businesses in our town.

Union Public Works has been expanding water lines in parts of the town and adding fire hydrants as part of the process. If you have a new fire hydrant near your home, check with your insurance carrier as this may have a positive impact on your rates.

The recent auditor's report from Rowell, Craven & Short shows that the town is in sound financial condition. From a projected annual budget deficit 3 years ago, the town will now report a \$200,000+ surplus of revenue over expenses. This can be attributed to conservative budgets, tight fiscal spending and other actions taken by the council. We are now able to fund in the budget a new line item *infrastructure* category to support roads, street lighting and other growing needs of the town while keeping taxes unchanged.

Town Hall, also known as the Thomas-Wren House, is a 124-year-old historical building and a visible landmark at the corner of Hwy 84 and Weddington-Matthews road. . . affectionately known as *the yellow house*. Restoration efforts over the past year to the foundation, brick work, roof repairs and grounds will insure the viability of this building for years to come.

We are here to serve you. We encourage you to engage in your community. Town Council meetings are the second Monday of each month at 7pm.
